
6TH GRADE ACADIENCE AND GROWTH MEASURE

95 PERCENT GROUP

Great news! The Phonics Lesson Library decodable passages are now available to download and print! Coaches can find them by logging in to 95percentgroup.com and clicking on the related PLL. We have also downloaded them into a shared folder for easy access: Decodable Passages. These can be used to supplement the phonics chip

These can be used to supplement the phonics chip kit lessons in Walk to Read or to provide extra practice in classrooms or other WTR groups.



Did you know that 95 Percent Group's name relates to the research that 95% of students are cognitively capable of reading? While there is a small group of students with severe cognitive disabilities who struggle to learn to read, they are not generally found in the regular classroom. The vast majority of students are capable of learning to read with sufficient instruction. Effective tier one instruction and targeted interventions are essential to accomplishing this goal. If you have a large number of students needing intervention, strengthen tier one instruction. For students who aren't making progress in 95% skill groups, consider these questions.
