What is Farm to School

Utah's champion for agriculture, Gov Cox is often referred to as Utah's 'Farmer in Chief'. He recently discussed how important our local food production is. He said, "We have strategic oil reserves and innovation in the field of energy and natural resources, which has helped make us more self-sustaining for energy, but the only thing we need more than energy is food. We haven't historically taken that same approach with food."

Jordan School District supports Gov Cox's sentiments that food and agriculture are an important part of our lives. Jordan's Nutrition Services is beginning a program called Farm to School. This is a national, state, and local program where students are educated on the importance of making informed food choices. Students gain an understanding of where their food comes from, how it is grown, and the effects it has on the health of their bodies. They are also taught how the community and environment are impacted by food production.

Jordan would love your support as we move forward to bring local and regional foods into our cafeteria. Local beef is coming to our cafeterias soon. Be on the look out in March for more information!
